INTRODUCTION

What's This Guide About

There are many Trust Funds and Charities that have been set up to support students in Higher Education. This Guide lists a selection of the Trust Funds & Charities who may be able to offer you financial support.

Applying for Grants from Trust Funds/Charities

When applying to trust funds/charities you are advised to consider the criteria carefully as organisations often have very limited funding and will not consider applications unless they meet their specific criteria.

Eligibility may depend upon a wide range of criteria, for example:

- where an applicant is from
- where they went to school
- their chosen course or career path
- whether they have a disability or medical condition
- whether they are at a financial disadvantage compared to other students
