Loans awarded by Futures for Women rarely exceed £1,000 per annum. Successful grantees will be asked to sign a loan agreement and supply a Guarantor who will also be asked to sign a legal agreement. Grantees are expected to commence repayment of the loan within 3 months of securing employment. Full repayment of the loan is due within 2 years of commencing repayments.

Applications will only be considered from women who have been resident in the UK, Isle of Man or Channel Islands for at least three years.

However, women who are eligible for a Postgraduate Loan may apply. The grant awarded is normally between £200 and £400, and support course fees only. Grants are paid direct to institutions on behalf of applicants. No payments are made to individuals.

Applications are accepted from Women who:

- Are British citizens.
- Are aged 21 and over.
- Have a confirmed offer of a place at a British educational institution.
- Are not eligible for Student Finance support and require help with course fees.
- Are not related to a member of the Yorkshire Ladies' Council of Education.
- Women who are eligible for a Postgraduate Loan are also eligible for support.
