Support for Technical Proficiency in English (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar - SPG)

Although students are working at Higher Education level, there are some resources which have been designed for KS2 or KS3/4 pupils which serve as useful reminders of the basics. Other resources concentrate on academic writing and assignment structure.
